The purpose of this memo is to remind Part D sponsors of the need to execute and submit a revised Business Associate Agreement (BAA) with the Part D Transaction Facilitation Contractor, NDCHealth dba RelayHealth, to cover TrOOP and coordination of benefit (COB)-related functions. The requirement to execute a BAA with the Transaction Facilitator is addressed in our guidance in Section 50.13 of Chapter 14 of the Medicare Prescription Drug Benefit Manual. Because the Transaction Facilitation Contractor performs TrOOP and COB functions on behalf of the Part D sponsor when it receives data directly from the sponsor, each Part D sponsor must enter into a BAA with the Transaction Facilitation Contractor, consistent with the HIPAA Privacy Rule (45 CFR Part 160 and Subparts A and E of Part 164). A revised BAA is necessary to address recent changes to the HIPAA Privacy Rule.

The Office for Civil Rights (OCR) codified new HIPAA Privacy Rule requirements in an omnibus final rule that was published on January 25, 2013 (78 FR 5566), which addresses a number of HIPAA-related issues. Among other things, the omnibus regulation extended certain HIPAA requirements to business associates. The attached BAA is intended to reflect these changes.

The omnibus changes went into effect on September 23, 2013. However, provided that the governing agreements were not modified prior to that date, sponsors have been given until September 1, 2014 to execute revised BAAs. To ensure no lapse in services, plan sponsors should complete and sign the updated BAA as soon as possible. The BAA, an implementation form and instructions for the completion and submission of the documents are available on the Facilitator's website at http://medifacd.relayhealth.com/fir/baa.

As part of the forthcoming annual Readiness Checklist Assessment for 2015, we are

requiring sponsors to report if the executed BAA covers all contracts and, if appropriate, to specify which contracts are not covered and the projected date for executing a BAA to include these contracts. CMS will consider sponsors without an executed BAA in place by September 1, 2014 for existing plans and/or January 1, 2015 for new plans effective in 2015 out of compliance with Part D requirements related to COB and TrOOP balance tracking and transfer. Such sponsors may receive compliance notices from CMS and, in the event of continued non-compliance, may be subject to intermediate sanctions (e.g., suspension of marketing and enrollment activities) pursuant to 42 C.F.R. Part 423, Subpart O. We plan to include further details on this information collection effort in the annual Readiness Checklist Assessment instructions.
